

STARTING POINT

Collégiale Saint-Vincent, Grand Place, 1

ROUTE DESCRIPTION

Starting from the historic centre of Soignies and its **Collégiale Saint Vincent**, a jewel of Romanesque art, you will head to the pretty village of **Neufvilles**. While following the country paths, you will see the grandiose spectacle offered by the **blue stone quarries**, from which the famous “little granite” which has made Soignies famous has been extracted for more than 125 years.



A little further, going towards Chaussée-Notre-Dame by the Ravel, you will see **the farm of the Abbey**, last farm that depended on the Abbey of Cambron.



Arrived in **Louvignies**, you can admire **the Castle of the Villegas family**. This magnificent building, furnished and modernized in the 18th and 19th century, tells the daily life of the **Belle Epoque**.



At the entrance of **Horrues**, go up to **the church of Saint-Martin** (Place d'Horrues), a superb Romanesque and Gothic building of the 13th century. Then continue on your way to Soignies through a **rural landscape**, dotted with pretty valleys.

Throughout your itinerary, you will see several **private castles**.
